

Wonderful places in Malaysia

Kuala Lumpur or KL is a modern cosmopolitan city boasting the world's tallest twin towers towering at a height of 452m. A panoramic view of KL is possi-



ble from the 41st-storey bridge connecting the two Petronas Twin Towers. Visitors can opt to visit an interactive gallery known as Petrosains, which focuses on Malaysia's oil and gas industry. Besides that, Menara Kuala Lumpur or KL Tower at 421m is the best location for a 360° aerial view of the city. There is a revolving restaurant with a highly recommended evening buffet. Other

interesting spots are the old Kuala Lumpur Railway Station and National Museum.





Genting Highlands, dubbed the "City of Entertainment" is situated at the border of Pahang and Selangor. It offers indoor and outdoor theme parks, hotels, an 18-hole golf course and a casino. Being located up in the highlands means it's cooler than the steamy lowlands.

Other places with milder climates are Bukit Tinggi and Fraser's Hill. Bukit Tinggi is just over an hour's drive from Kuala Lumpur City Centre and lies some 2,500 feet above sea level. Colmar Tropicale in Bukit Tinggi is a replica of a collection of buildings from a north-eastern village in France dating back to the 16th Century. On the other hand, with a cooling

> countryside and rich natural heritage, Fraser's Hill attracts golfers and bird-watchers from





across the country. Historical, colonial-styled bungalows scatter the landscape, many turned into resorts to accommodate guests for the weekend.

Malacca is a famous historical port strategically located on the Straits of Malacca. Old buildings and traditional trades and crafts make Malacca one of Malaysia's most visited destinations. Buildings reflecting Portuguese, Dutch and British influences and the city centre are ideal for sightseeing. Historical places include the Stadthuys, Christ Church, St. Paul's Church and the A' Formosa fortress built by the Portuguese in 1511.



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Minangkabau architecture, with its distinctive horn-shaped roofs dating back to 17th century Sumatra, dominates in Seremban, the capital of Negeri Sembilan. Observe the magnificent roofs rise into two peaks like buffalo horns.
